## Boat Show by Dave

The show was quite busy on Saturday morning and that looked good for it being busy all the time. However, Saturday afternoon and Sunday were quite quiet. I am told there were 2500 people through on Saturday.

We gave out a lot of information on the 2022 Fly Fishing Course, a number of Club information sheets/calendars and signed up two new members. Hopefully we will get some Fly Fishing Course enrolments as a result of the show.

We packed up a little early on Sunday and I was able to get the trailer to the nearest emergency exit so we didn't have to take the stuff very far. We soon had it back to Fish & Game and we were away home.

This presented the additional problem of having to protect the table from the vice clamps. I set up our table we take to displays along one side in addition another small table and this reduced the number of people who wanted to use vices on the main table and we used some small pieces of MDF and the desk pads to protect the table from vices. Those of us with flat based vices didn't have a problem.

We did have a better turnout of members than usual and this included one who had never tied flies before (he finished the day with a number of usable flies). This resulted in most of the tuition being on very basic flies, hares ear and pheasant tail nymphs.

All those who attended enjoyed their day and I know I managed to get a few flies tied for next season.


## Competitions by Julie

## Pitsford Pea Mini Lure by Jim



Bring Copper Bead up to hook eye, also at this stage slip green bead up the hook or tie in one turn of chenille in later.



Start thread behind green bead.



Tear Marabou tail to length and tie in



Add two double turns of Green Krystal flash to tail.  
Bring Green Bead down so that it pushes down on the Marabou tail gluing it whilst doing so.  
Alternatively tie in one turn of green chenille on top of the tail.



Tie in the Micro Fritz or similar



Twist Micro Fritz as you run three turns up to the head before tying off at the head.

### Materials:

Hook	Kamasan B-175 size 10 or similar
Thread	Uni-Thread 6/0 or 8/0 Black
Tail	Black Marabou (Turkey) and two doubled turns of green Krystal Flash.
Beads	Head 3/16 in Copper/ Silver/ Gold
Abdomen	Green Bead Plastic or one turn of green chenille tied in to substitute.
Thorax	Micro Fritz MF 4 Black Pearl or similar.
